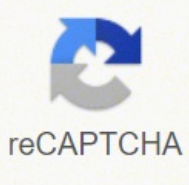

## What is the best long pole hedge trimmer

Before choosing a pole hedge trimmer, you need to consider several different features and factors. You need to think about the type of trimmer you want, whether it be a gas hedge trimmer, a cordless hedge trimmer, or a traditional corded electric hedge trimmer. You also have to think about the size and weight of your chosen model, along with the extension and reach of the blade. You need to think about the hedges you plan on trimming and try to find a model that matches up with the needs of your property, rather than simply buying the first one you see or the most expensive model on the market. Type One of the first things to think about when buying a pole hedge trimmer is the type of trimmer you want to buy. In general, pole hedge trimmers can be classified into a few different categories: cordless electric, corded electric, and gas. Cordless electric pole hedge trimmers are popular in modern times due to their convenience. Just like cordless vacuum cleaners or other cordless accessories, they allow the user to charge them up and then use them freely, without the need for power outlets and extension cords. Corded electric pole hedge trimmers are more traditional and have the advantage of not needing to be charged up or refueled with gas over time. All you need to do is plug them in and you can use them continuously without any issues, but it can be frustrating to make the cord reach your hedges. Finally, gas powered pole hedge trimmers, as the name implies, have to be loaded up with gas which the motor burns as a fuel source. They offer the same sorts of advantages as cordless trimmers, but you need to invest in additional fuel and refuel them regularly to keep them working. Extension The extension of a pole hedge trimmer tells us how far it can reach. The key advantage of using a pole hedge trimmer over a traditional hedge trimmer is that they allow you to reach high places and further distances, without needing to stretch your arms out or climb up ladders. You can use a pole hedge trimmer to reach right to the top of tall hedges with ease, and it's important to measure your hedges and see what kind of extension you actually need before buying a model. Pole hedge trimmers like the Greenworks 22272 offer very impressive extension ratings. Blade type and length Next, let's consider the blade type and length. In general, if you're looking for a high quality pole hedge trimmer, you should find a model with double-sided blades. This is the industry standard and allows you to cut and trim hedges with ease from various angles and positions. The blade length is another big factor, as some trimmers claim to offer high extension but only have short blades, which can be less convenient to use. The longer the blades, the more practical and useful the trimmer will actually be. 20 inch blades can be found on the Doeworks Pole Hedge Trimmer. Cutting capacity The main purpose of a hedge trimmer is to cut hedges, so the cut capacity is a very important factor to think about. It's a term that often features in cordless pole hedge trimmer reviews and electric pole hedge trimmer reviews, and it tells us what diameter the branches of a trimmer can cut. The higher the cut capacity, the greater the cutting potential of the trimmer in question. You don't always need a super high cutting capacity, depending on what kinds of hedges you have, but if you're looking for a model with a high rating, the Earthwise CVPH41018 is a good choice. SPM SPM stands for strokes per minute, and this is another interesting and important aspect of pole hedge trimmers to consider. In general, hedge trimmers work with two separate layers of blades moving on top of each other. The SPM rating shows how quickly these two layers of blades move back and forth. The higher the SPM, the greater the rate of movement. Higher SPM can therefore result in stronger cutting power, but this also depends on the power of the motor and the sharpness and quality of the blades themselves as well. The MAXTRA offers a very impressive SPM rating of 3000, and Greenworks 22272 is an overall champion with 3200 SPM. Noise level It's no secret that pole hedge trimmers, as well as other kinds of hedge trimmer, make a lot of noise when in action. The overall noise level of any hedge trimmer is usually measured in decibels, and the lower the decibel rating, the quieter the trimmer will be. You can actually find some hedge trimmers that are relatively quiet compared to the competition, but it is usually recommended to wear protective earplugs or headsets to protect your hearing while using these devices for extended periods of time. Weight Weight might seem like a simple factor at first, but it's actually a very important aspect to consider when buying a hedge trimmer. Don't forget that when using a pole hedge trimmer, you're often going to be holding it up for quite a long period of time to get the job done. If the trimmer is too heavy, this can become very difficult and lead to aches and pains in the arms, shoulders, and back. This is especially true for people who aren't used to doing much physical work and tend to tire easily, or those with pre-existing injuries or weaknesses in their muscles. That's why it can be highly beneficial to try and find a relatively lightweight and maneuverable model like the Sun Joe SJH902E. Warranty Pole hedge trimmers aren't exactly cheap, so if you're going to buy one, it helps to have coverage and protection for your purchase. Every manufacturer has their own approach to warranty policy. Some of them offer very long, extended warranties, like the 4-year warranty seen on the Greenworks 22272, for example. Extra features In addition to features like extension, blade length, and power source, many of the best pole hedge trimmers out there also come with additional features and functionality, designed to offer an edge over the competition. The GARCARE GPH107, for example, comes with a 6-position pivoting head to help you maneuver around your hedges and trim them into different shapes or at different angles with ease. The Earthwise CVPH41018 also features an adjustable and rotating head for ease of use. There are also models like the Greenworks 22272, which offers super fast charging times and long runtimes for your convenience. Pole hedge trimmer usage and maintenance So now you know what to look for when shopping for your next pole hedge trimmer, but how do you actually use these devices and what are the best ways to look after them? First of all, the instructions for each specific model of hedge trimmer will vary from one product to the next, but they usually tend to follow the same basic pattern. You'll usually need to lubricate the blades with oil or spray before use to help them to move smoothly, as well as remembering to lay out some tarpaulin on the ground to catch the debris and provide a firm surface for you. Use slow, steady movements when guiding the trimmer around the hedges and always hold the blade of the trimmer away from your body. Don't forget to clear away the trimmings and take breaks now and then too. For maintaining your hedge trimmer, always remember to use oil to lubricate the blades and check them over periodically for any debris, sticks, grass, or dirt that might get into the machine and clog up the system. Be sure to check the blade sharpness levels too and get the blades sharpened either professionally or by yourself on a regular basis. Don't use water, but be sure to clean your trimmer now and then too by wiping it over with a cloth and cleaning out the fuel tank, filter, and other key parts. If you're short on time, we're happy to cut to the chase: the BLACK+DECKER LPHT120 Cordless Pole Hedge Trimmer is our "best overall" pick. What did we like so much? The 20v Lithium-ion battery is very easy and convenient to work with. And the 18-inch dual blade are very effective at cutting branches up to 7/16-inch in diameter. And the fact that you can extend this up to 6.5 feet really makes trimming around the yard easy. However, there are some drawbacks to consider. The blade was a bit flimsier than we would have liked, the trimmer may be a bit too heavy for some users' tastes. Maintaining your yard is one thing and maintaining your bank account is another. Nobody wants to run out of one kind of "green" while managing another! So, if you're looking for the best pole hedge trimmers for the money, the Sun Joe SJH904E Electric Pole Hedge Trimmer is our "best value" pick. In addition to the awesome price, this trimmer is easy to assemble. And the dual action blade makes it highly effective. Finally, this is a versatile tool: you can convert it from pole hedger to hand hedger, and even extend the pole until you have a solid 13 feet of reach. Why, then, did we not choose this trimmer for our best overall pick? The blade is weak and the tool is somewhat hard to control. Sometimes, you're flush with extra cash. If you've got some extra green and want to buy a premium product, we recommend the Makita XN101Z Pole Hedge Trimmer. What premium features does this model offer? First, it's lightweight: at just north of 12 pounds, this model is 35% lighter than most gas-based trimmers. And the 20-inch dual-action steel blade provides awesome performance. Finally, you get six different settings and an effective 115-degrees of working range. Still, there are some downsides to consider. While the battery-based trimmer performs well, you must buy a battery separately. And while its 80 minutes of runtime with certain batteries is impressive, the truth is that it just can't last as long as a gas-based trimmer. The Earthwise LPHT12022 Cordless Pole Hedge Trimmer didn't manage to make it into our top three picks. Nonetheless, this is one of the more versatile and reliable trimmers on the market. The 20-volt 2.0Ah lithium-ion battery performs well, and this trimmer comes with a charger. The dual-action blade makes short work of limbs up to 3/8 inches thick. There are six adjustable positions for this trimmer, and you can use them all with the peace of mind that comes from solid warranties (a two-year warranty for the trimmer and a one-year warranty for the battery). Still, there are drawbacks to consider. First, it does not telescope properly as advertised. And second, the trimmer is uncomfortable to use after long periods of time. Looking for a "middle of the road" tool that can get the job done? In that case, the WORX WG252 Pole Hedge Trimmer may be exactly what you have been looking for. At only 7.6 pounds, we enjoyed the lightweight design of this trimmer. And the 10-position adjustable head is very impressive. The rotating rear handle will keep you comfortable, and the included 20V 2.0Ah Battery and charger are very convenient. What's not to love? One issue is that the teeth are a bit too small for anything thicker than 1/4 inch. And another issue is that it is a bit awkward to maneuver around while using this trimmer. The Greenworks PH40B210 Cordless Pole Hedge Trimmer helps to kick off the second half of our review roundup. But don't let the placement fool you: this is a surprisingly effective pole hedge trimmer! We liked that it came with G-max 40V and 20V batteries and a charger, allowing you to work for longer periods of time. And the 20-inch dual-action steel blade is durable and effective. It's great for branches up to 3/8 of an inch, and the pivoting head and 6.5-foot extension make it surprisingly versatile. So, why is this great trimmer not higher on our list? The fact that it requires three buttons to start is a bit annoying. On top of that, it has a weak shaft that you will need to keep your eyes on. In a perfect world, you want a trimmer that has more benefits than drawbacks. But the Powerworks XB 40V 20-Inch Cordless Pole Hedge Trimmer is a mixed bag in almost every way! What did we like about this trimmer? The 20-inch dual-action blade is reliable, and the 2.0Ah Battery and charger are convenient. Finally, the warranties (4 years on the trimmer and 2 years on the battery) provide a lot of peace of mind. At the same time, it jams fairly easily. And some users have encountered alignment issues with the teeth. For some users, the lack of adjustable pole length may be a real dealbreaker. With every review roundup, some of the tools are going to be more impressive than others. Not every trimmer can be a winner. And we're said to say that the Craftsman CMXGHAMD25HT Pole Hedge Trimmer is a trimmer you are better off avoiding altogether. There are some nice things about it, including the easy pull start. And the 22-inch dual-action blade is impressive. But this is where the positive qualities come to an end. What are the issues with this trimmer? First, the 25cc engine is very weak, and it's also very noisy. And some users report that the gearbox breaks very easily. Overall, there are too many issues with this trimmer to make it worth your while. You might associate the DEWALT name with quality tools. Unfortunately, the DEWALT DCPH820M1 Pole Hedge Trimmer is one of the worst trimmers on our list. There were some things that we liked, including the 22-inch dual-action blade and the 7-position articulating head. Aside from these things, though, there isn't much reason to recommend this trimmer. What were our issues with the trimmer? Despite the description, it doesn't actually extend. And the handle location, along with trimmer length, makes it hard to hold. Finally, some users reported that it was a bit too heavy for prolonged use. The RYOBI RY40603BTL Cordless Pole Hedge Trimmer looks like a simple tool to get the job done. But it turns out that this is so simple that you'd be better off with almost any other trimmer. There were some decent qualities, including the 18-inch dual-action blades and the convenient variable speed trigger. Beyond this, though, most of the qualities of this trimmer are a bit of a letdown. What disappointed us? The lack of battery and charger means you nearly double the cost to get a functional trimmer. And some users report that the machine died after only a few uses. Finally, the 8-foot extension is a bit disappointing compared to other models. All you have to do is plug them into an outlet and you have all the power you'll need for your yard work. There are several benefits to electric hedge trimmers. First, they tend to be the cheapest models available. On top of that, they are lightweight because no battery weighs them down. Finally, these trimmers tend to run quieter than other models, and you'll have the peace of mind knowing that your tool is very environmentally friendly. Honestly, there is only one downside, but it's a fairly big one. By definition, an electric trimmer needs to be plugged into an outlet the entire time you are using it. This means you may need to invest in some serious extension cords, and this adds to the cost of your purchase and the overall setup whenever you start trimming. Cordless Cordless trimmers are powered by batteries instead of by electricity or gasoline. This gives them the portability that you need to get to those "hard to reach" areas around your home. On top of being portable, these trimmers tend to be much quieter than gas-powered ones. There are really only two downsides to consider: First, if you have a large yard, you may need a second battery to complete the entire yard. And second, these models tend to be more expensive than electric ones, especially if the trimmer in question doesn't come with its own battery and charger. Gasoline Gas-powered trimmers are the most powerful of the bunch. And they also last much longer than battery-powered trimmers, which is good if you have a big job ahead of you. With that being said, there are several drawbacks to gas-powered trimmers. They tend to be more expensive than other trimmers, and they are harder to start. Finally, they require more maintenance than other types of trimmers. Trimmer Blade In many ways, the effectiveness of any pole hedge trimmer comes down to the blade. And the size of the blade helps determine exactly what the trimmer can do. If your hedges are average or even small, you can get away with a blade as small as 16". For average or slightly larger hedges, 18" can do the trick. And for larger, more robust hedges, you'll want a blade that is 20" or larger. In addition to blade length, pay attention to how far apart the teeth are for each trimmer you consider buying. Larger, tougher hedges are going to need teeth that are further apart to get the job done. Overall Weight Because you will be holding the hedge trimmer for long periods of time, it's important to pay attention to how much it weighs. While there may be slight variations in weight for any type of trimmer, you can usually determine how heavy a trimmer is by what kind of trimmer it is. Generally speaking, electric models are the lightest in weight. And cordless models are also fairly light. Gas-powered trimmers are the heaviest of all, though this is the tradeoff for the power they provide. Beyond that, different users have different ideas of what is too heavy and what is not. It all comes down to understanding your own upper body strength. Comfort In addition to weight, another big feature to consider is whether the trimmer is comfortable to hold. And certain features can make any trimmer more comfortable than its competition. If a trimmer has multiple handles, it is generally easier to hold and use. And trimmers with multiple power switches make it easy for you to comfortably turn the model on and off. Finally, models with less vibration (such as dual-action models) are going to be far more comfortable to use. Noise During Use Certain hedge trimmers are louder than others. The best example of this is that gas-powered models are far louder than electric or portable models. With that being said, all hedge trimmers are relatively loud. We recommend wearing protective gear over your ears to protect your hearing during use. Rotating Head Many of the pole hedge trimmers we reviewed feature rotating heads. And this feature is more important than you might expect when it comes to efficient and comfortable use. With a rotating head, you can move the head to the desired angle while still holding the trimmer in a comfortable grip. This helps keep you from getting fatigued while also helping you to trim every single hedge and bush to perfection. Extension Length Some pole hedge trimmers extend and some don't. For that matter, some extend more than others. How much extension you need comes down to how high your hedges are. If your hedges are really tall, a trimmer with a good extension length can help you trim the top without dragging a ladder out into your yard. But if your hedges aren't that high to begin with, you can afford to get a trimmer with little to no extension length. Clipping Collector If we were devising a list of "extra" feature for pole hedge trimmers, a clipping collector would be near the top of the list. Do you absolutely need a collector on your trimmer? No. But having one makes cleaning up your yard that much easier, and it may ultimately save you a lot of time and a lot of sweat! Batteries Have you decided to go with a cordless trimmer? That's a solid choice. But how well it works is mostly going to come down to the battery that powers the whole thing. By doing your homework on different battery models, you can get a good idea of how long it will last on a full charge. If it will take longer than that to work through your entire yard, then you might as well invest in a second battery so you can swap out for continuous use. If fiddling with the batteries is more trouble than it's worth, you might want to consider either electric or gas-powered trimmers. It all comes down to personal preference and the size of your yard. Conclusion Congrats! You may not have trimmed those pesky hedges yet, but you've successfully completed our reviews and our thorough buyer's guide.
